Do not submit work evaluations.**
- o Proof of acceptance or admission (or equivalent) letter from the institution of choice (first-time applicants only, unless there is a change of institution).
- An essay, prepared by the applicant (500 words maximum) neatly typed and double-spaced, **signed and dated (note: must be signed and dated)** in response to one of the following:
 - Describe some strategies you would use to convince state employees to stay in the union following last year's Supreme Court Janus decision.
 - Describe the impact of Right to Work legislation on government employees.
 - Explain a current issue affecting Alaskan union members and how AFSCME/ASEA has or can address it
 - Describe what ASEA/AFSCME Local 52 has meant to your family. Please include specific examples.
- Note: essays may not be repeated from prior years
