The Statewide Elections Committee conducted a count of the Delegate's to the 40th AFSCME International Convention.

The voting instruction was that members were to vote for no more than ten (10) candidates. Based on the allocation by AFSCME International, Local 52 will be allocated twelve (12) delegates. Article 14.01 A & B of the ASEA Constitution provides that the President, Secretary, and Treasurer shall automatically be the 1st, 3rd, and 5th delegates. Therefore, the top nine (9) vote getters will be awarded the non-officer delegate positions to the 40th International Convention; all other candidates will be ranked alternates according to their vote totals. If alternates are required they will serve in the order of the number of votes received.
