ASEA/AFSCME 2016 Convention Delegates Announced

The ASEA Elections Committee conducted a ballot count of the candidates to attend AFSCME's 42nd International Convention on July 18 - 22, 2016. A total of 692 votes were cast. Voting instructions to members were to vote for no more than nine (9) candidates. Based on the allocation by AFSCME International, Local 52 is allowed twelve (12) delegates. Article 14.01 A & B of the ASEA Constitution provides that the President, Secretary and Treasurer shall automatically be the 1st, 3rd and 5th delegates. Therefore, the top nine vote getters are non-officer delegates to the Convention. All other delegates are ranked alternates according to their vote totals. If alternates are required, they will serve in the order of the number of votes received

- 1st Delegate - President Dawn Bundick
- 3rd Delegate - Secretary Michael Williams
- 5th Delegate - Treasurer John White

Two hundred fifty-two (252) (names will be added to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Wall next month. Out of those 252 names, 112 were officers who died in the line of duty last year. This Memorial is dedicated to Law Enforcement Officers, Correctional Officers and Probation & Parole Officers.

I had the privilege of attending the Candlelight Vigil Ceremony with about 25,000 peace officers to show our respect to those that had fallen in the line of duty. I also had the honor of viewing the names of Alaska State Troopers Gabriel "Gabe" Rich and Sgt. Patrick "Scott" Johnson who died in the line of duty on May 1, 2014 and were placed on the Memorial Wall in 2015 and Tage Brandel Toll, whose name was placed on the wall in 2014.

If you ever get a chance to visit Washington D.C., please stop by the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial located on "E" Street N.W., between 4th and 5th Street, to honor our fallen officers.
