

## **Education Leadership (PEL) Conference**

The ASEA/AFSCME Local 52 Political Education Leadership (PEL) Conference held in Juneau on February 7-8, 2017, provided ASEA members with an opportunity to observe their elected officials at work. In addition, members observed a joint legislative session of the House and Senate which began with legislators introducing gallery visitors from their respective

Members also observed Alaska's 40 House members and 20 Senators unite for a "2017 State of the Judiciary" address by Alaska Supreme Court Chief Justice Craig Stowers. It was remarkable to observe these three branches of government interacting in the State Capitol after spending a part of the previous day with Governor Walker and Lt. Governor Mallot. The PEL Conference provided ASEA members with a better understanding of Alaska's political process.

Women's History Month had its origins as a national celebration in 1981 when Congress passed PL. 97-28 which authorized and requested the President to proclaim the week beginning March 7, 1982 as

"Women's History Week." Throughout the next five years, Congress continued to pass joint resolutions designating a week in March as "Women's History Week." In 1987, after being petitioned by the National Women's History Project, Congress passed PL. 100-9 which designated the month of March 1987, as "Women's History Month." Between 1988 and 1994, Congress passed additional resolutions requesting and authorizing the President to proclaim March of each year as Women's History Month. Since 1995, Presidents Clinton, Bush and Obama have issued a series of annual proclamations designating the month of March as "Women's History Month." Celebrate a woman in your workplace and your life. Our ASEA/AFSCME Local 52 Women's Issues Committee (WIC) is offering pink wear on our PINK LINK webpage. In May, the WIC will be offering our "Woman of ASEA" scholarship, so We have women in every profession and occupation who work hard everyday while also taking care of their families. Let's tell your story through the Never Quit video campaign. Contact your local Chapter President and make that video.
