<u>Definition</u>: Under immediate supervision, performs general office work; i.e., typing, photocopying, filing, data input and receptionist/mail clerk duties.

Distinguishing Characteristics: The Secretary assists business agents, organizers and administrative staff in general office duties. As vital support to these positions, the Secretary will frequently be the first and sometimes the only point of contact with the public and Union members and is required to receive calls and visitors with a professional and courteous demeanor, while putting them at ease and asking pertinent questions tactfully and giving information and directions clearly.

Examples of Duties:

- Receptionist/mail clerk duties;
- •Assists in scheduling new hire orientation and welcomes new members, assists in preparing and distributing New Hire packets;
- Processes and transmits data, tracks and organizes large volumes of information;
- Staff support in typing, filing, data entry, report production, photocopying;
- •Maintains common areas such as the break room, copier room, and reception area;
- •Maintains various logs; maintains and updates reference material; and,
- •Assists in office and floor activities during conferences, trainings, and conventions.

Employment Standards: This is a 40-hour workweek position, with work schedule from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Education and experience equivalent to graduation from high school and three years of work experience involving substantial contact with public. Work experience should reflect the need for a clear speaking voice, tact, courtesy and demonstrate excellent people skills in a fast-paced office. Typing speed of 60 wpm and demonstrated experience in Outlook, PowerPoint, Word and Excel is required.

September 11 - 12, 2017 State Executive Board Meeting - Sitka December 13 - 14, 2017 State Executive Board Meeting -Fairbanks A possible Government shutdown has been avoided. The Alaska State House and the Alaska State Senate passed the FY2018 Operating Budget late Thursday night June 22, 2017.

The next step in the process is that the budget has to be signed by Governor Walker. Since Governor Walker called the Legislature into special session to pass a FY2018 budget and avoid a shutdown, I am sure he will sign it so it is in place prior to July 1. He does have the ability to "line item" veto budget appropriations and he may use that constitutional power if there are specific line items he thinks should be reduced or are not appropriate.
