We had our State Eboard meeting and completed our business in one day!

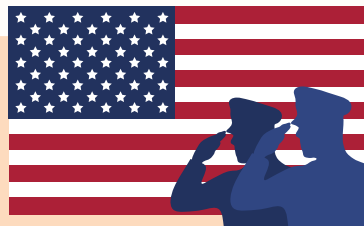
